PROVISION

I. General Provisions

1.1. The competition “International Cup of Fellowship of Kyokushinkai Karate Federations among Teenage Boys and Girls, Junior Men and Women, Men and Women in kumite is held in accordance with the calendar plan of the International Union of Professionals in the Sphere of Single Combats “Kyokushin Profi”.

1.2. The competitions is held according to the rules of the International Union “Kyokushin Profi”.

1.3. Goals and objectives:

1.3.1. Involving all segments of the population, and especially young people, in regular exercising of physical education and sports.

1.3.2. Formation of high moral, physical qualities and all-round developed personality.

1.3.3. Promotion of healthy lifestyles.

1.3.4. Strengthening friendly and sports ties.

1.3.5. Improvement of sports mastery.

1.3.6. Popularization of the Kyokushinkai Karate Style.

1.3.7. Competitors are prohibited from exerting unlawful influence on the results of sports competitions.

1.3.8. Competition participants are prohibited from participating in gambling in bookmakers’ offices and betting houses by placing bets on official sports competitions in accordance with the requirements established by Paragraph 3 of Part 4 of Article 26.2 of the Federal Law dated December 04, 2007 No. 329-Ф3 “On Physical Culture and Sports in Russian Federation”.

II. Place and Dates of the Competitions

2.1. Venue: “Activity Hall” Flotiliya Shopping Mall, bld. 1, 7 Flotskaya str., Moscow

2.2. Arrival date: April 19, 2024.

2.3. On April 19, 2024, all participants and team representatives must undergo a Mandate Commission and control weighing, which will take place from 10:00 to 16:00 at the address: “Activity Hall” Flotiliya Shopping Mall, bld. 1, 7 Flotskaya str., Moscow.

2.4. The Referee Seminar will take place on April 19, 2024 from 17:00 to 19:00 at the address: “Activity Hall” Flotiliya Shopping Mall, bld. 1, 7 Flotskaya str., Moscow.

2.5. On April 20 at 09:00 the elimination fights will take place.

2.6. On April 21 at 10:00 there will be an Opening Parade, final fights in the categories of 16-17 years old, men, women and professional fights according to the Kyokushin Profi version.

III. Competition Organizers

3.1. General management of the preparation and conduct of competitions is carried out by the International Union “Kyokushin Profi”.

3.2. The direct conduct of the competition is entrusted to the Main Judges’ Board, approved by the International Union “Kyokushin Profi”:

The Main Judge of the competition is Anatolii Fesenko.

The Chief Secretary of the competition is Ekaterina Bogdanova.

3.3. The competition organizers are not responsible for possible injuries received during the competition.

IV. General Information about the Competition

4.1. April 19 – teams arrival day.

4.2. April 19 from 10:00 to 16:00 – Credentials Committee.

4.3. April 20 at 09:00 – elimination fights.

4.4. April 21 at 10:00 – Opening Parade.

4.5. April 21 at 10:40 – final fights in the categories of 16-17 years old, men and women.

4.6. April 21 at 14:00 – professional fights according to the Kyokushin Profi version.

4.7. The competition is carried out in the following sports disciplines:

Attention! If by the results of weighing at the Admission Commission, an athlete will not fit in the declared weight category, this athlete will not be allowed to participate!

4.8. Protective devices

4.8.1. Teenage boys 12-13 years old, 14-15 years old, junior men 16-17 years old:

- hand protectors, shingarts (finger-cut gloves);
- shin protectors with mandatory protection of the insteps of the foot (white);
- helmet with mandatory chin protection (white);

- groin cup.
- 4.8.2. Teenage girls 12-13 years old, 14-15 years old, junior women 16-17 years old:
- hand protectors, shingarts (finger-cut gloves);
 - breast protection (cups only);
 - shin protectors with mandatory protection of the insteps of the foot (white);
 - helmet with mandatory chin protection (white);
 - groin bandage.
- 4.8.3. Men:
- groin cup.
- 4.8.4. Women:
- groin bandage;
 - breast protection (cups only).
- 4.8.5. Veterans men 35 years and older:
- hand protectors, shingarts (finger-cut gloves);
 - shin protectors with mandatory protection of the insteps of the feet;
 - a helmet on the head with mandatory chin protection;
 - knee pads;
 - groin cup.

Participants are allowed to use the following chest protector: the upper border of the protector is at the level of the second ribs, the lower border of the protector is not lower than the edge of the costal arches, the lateral borders of the protector are along the anterior axillary lines; The protector should only protect the chest.

All fighters must have individual protective equipment of the unified type.

4.9. Athletes in the following age groups are allowed to participate in competitions:

- teenage boys and girls (12-13 years old) – athletes born in 2011-2012;
- teenage boys and girls (14-15 years old) – athletes born in 2009-2010;
- junior men and junior women (16-17 years old) – athletes born in 2006-2008;
- men and women (18 years and older) – athletes born in 2006 and older;
- veterans (35-45 years old);
- veterans (46-55 years old).

In the age group of junior men, junior women (16-17 years old), athletes born in 2006 are admitted if they have not reached 18 years old before the start of the competition, i.e. until April 19, 2023.

In the age group of men and women, athletes born in 2006 are admitted if they have reached 18 years old before the start of the competition, i.e. before April 19, 2023.

The athlete's weight is determined by weighing on a scale.

Attention! If an athlete fails to appear on the tatami after being invited by a Judge-Informer within 1 minute, the athlete is counted as defeated.

4.10. Each Federation must provide judges - a minimum of 3 people, a maximum of 5 people. The judges' uniform is a white short-sleeved shirt (with the emblem of their Federation), a bow tie, a whistle, and dark classic trousers.

V. Requirements for Competition Participants and Conditions for Their Admission

5.1. Athletes with a style qualification of at least 7 kyu are allowed to participate in the competition.

5.2. At the Admission Commission, the team representative provides the original application (Schedule No. 1), and each participant must have the following documents:

5.2.1. identification document (up to 14 years old - Birth Certificate and School Certificate with a photo and a seal on the photo (or another document with a photo), 14 years old and older – passport of a foreign citizen);

5.2.2. a document confirming the athlete's stylistic qualifications;

5.2.3. original of the Compulsory Health Insurance Policy;

5.2.4. original of the Accident, Life and Health Insurance Agreement for the days of the tournament (insurance must be sports, or indicating the type of sport);

5.2.5. for minor athletes – consent of the athlete's parents that their child can practice Kyokushinkai karate and take part in the competition (Schedule No. 4);

5.2.6. for adult athletes – a personally written application addressed to the Chief Judge for voluntary participation in the competition (Schedule No. 5).

ATTENTION! In case of violation of any from the above points, the athlete will not be allowed to compete.

VI. Submission of Applications for Participation

6.1. Application deadlines:

ATTENTION!!!

According to preliminary applications, weigh-in and fight protocols will be drawn up in advance. Without submitting a preliminary application, the official application will not be accepted and fighters will not be allowed to participate in the tournament.

The preliminary application indicates the exact weight of the fighter.

6.2. List of documents required to participate in the competition:

– an official application of an approved sample, with the obligatory note of a doctor and a sports medical institution (Schedule 1);

– preliminary application indicating the exact weight of the fighter (Schedule 2);

– application for hotel reservation (Schedule 3);

– application (submitted to the Mandate Commission) (Schedule 4, 5).

6.3. During the Mandate Commission, participants must provide the following documents:

• Budo passport, which contains all the certificate numbers for each assigned Kyu, Dan;

- identification document;
- individual insurance policy;
- application from parents, application (waiver form) in the established form.

The team representative must submit an official application.

6.4. Registration fee is **50 Euros** per person and does not depend on the number of disciplines in which the athlete will take part. The fee for the entire team must be transferred **until March 15, 2024** inclusive. A check confirming payment must also be sent till March 15, 2024 inclusive to the mail: **info@kyokushinprofi.com**

6.5. Refund of the registration fee is possible only if a medical certificate is provided by a team representative.

ATTENTION! Without the specified documents and compliance with the requirements for them, a fighter is not allowed to participate in the tournament.

VII. Conditions for Summing up

7.1. In kumite competitions for teenage boys and girls, junior men and women, winners and prize-winners are determined according to the Olympic system with elimination after one defeat. The losing semi-finalists compete for the 3rd place.

7.2. If 3 athletes (teams) participate in a category, they fight in a round-robin system (“each against each”). The winner of this category is determined by the maximal number of victories. If each athlete (team) has one victory, then additional indicators of these participants are taken into account:

- in weight categories (in the following sequence):

- 1) the number of pure victories (Ippon scores);
- 2) the number of technical actions scored (“Waza-ari” scores);
- 3) the number of official reprimands and penalty points;
- 4) results of weighing the participants (the lighter participant takes a higher place).

7.3. The procedure for filing and considering protests is carried out in accordance with the Rules.

VIII. Awarding the Winners and Prizewinners

8.1. Winners and prizewinners of the competition (1st-3rd place) are awarded medals, diplomas and cups of appropriate degrees.

8.2. Additionally, memorable prizes may be gifted by sponsors and other organizations.

IX. Financing conditions

9.1. The International Union “Kyokushin Profi” covers the costs: rent of the venue, sound support, payment for the work of doctors and ambulance crews, judges, volunteers; award products and other expenses.

9.2. Accommodation, meals, travel and other expenses of participants are borne by sending organizations.

X. Ensuring the Safety of Participants and Spectators

In order to achieve the necessary safety of spectators and participants during the competition, carry out a preliminary check of the relevant conditions and safety rules during official sports competitions, approved by Decree of the Government of the Russian Federation dated April 18, 2014 No. 353.

Monitoring compliance with safety requirements rests with the Chief Judge of the competition and the Director of the sports facility. In order to achieve the necessary safety of spectators and participants during the competition, carry out a preliminary check of the relevant conditions and instructions “On safety Measures during Sports Events.”

The competitions is held at sports facilities that meet the requirements of the relevant regulatory legal acts in force on the territory of the Russian Federation and aimed at ensuring public order and the safety of participants and spectators.

Participation in the competition is carried out only if there is an Agreement (original) on Life and Health Insurance against Accidents, which is provided to the Mandate Commission for each participant.

The provision of emergency medical care is carried out in accordance with the order of the Ministry of Health of the Russian Federation dated October 23, 2020 No. 1144 н “On approval of the procedure for organizing the provision of medical care to persons involved in physical education and sports (including during the preparation and conduct of physical education and sports events), including the procedure for medical examination of persons wishing to undergo sports training, engage in physical education and sports in organizations and (or) fulfill the test standards of the All-Russian Physical Culture and Sports Complex “Ready for Labor and Defense” (GTO)” and forms of medical reports on admission to participation in physical education and sports events.”

The organizers provide medical personnel to the participants of the sports event.
